



Hobart Dog Training Club

Club Eligibility and Criteria for end of year Awards

1. Handler is a current financial member of HDTC
2. Active club member (handler or instructor) 50% of the year
3. Awarded to the dog with the highest title for each discipline (unless otherwise specified)
4. Handlers must submit their application prior to the 20th of November yearly. No late applications are considered.

Obedience

1. Club dog (assessed formally at club, highest scoring dog)
2. Trial dog (in the case of a tie, the highest scoring dog)

Rally

1. Senior dog (highest or most titles). In the case of a tie, the highest score, then fastest time.
2. Junior dog (achieves novice title). In the case of a tie, the highest score, then fastest time.

Agility

1. Senior dog (highest or most titles). In the case of a tie, the highest first placings or placing thereafter within the title.
2. Junior dog (achieves novice title). In the case of a tie, the highest first placings or placing thereafter within the title.

Scent work

1. Senior dog (highest total of all trial results combined (masters pass 4 points, Excellent 3, Advanced 2, Novice 1)
2. Junior dog (highest total of all trial results combined, for a dog that commenced trialling in the year)

Tracking

In the case of a tie, highest grading (Excellent, Very Good, Good, Pass)

Track & Search

In the case of a tie, highest grading (Excellent, Very Good, Good, Pass)

Other Performance Sports (e.g., including but not limited to herding, trick dog, lure coursing)

Where a club member achieves a title in a performance sport that is not organised by HDTC. The highest title in each sport is awarded a certificate.
